Australian Croquet Association's Annual General Meeting – 30 March 2009

The AGM will be held on Monday 30 March 2009 at 10.00am at the Master Builder's Association Offices, 52 Parramatta Road, Forest Lodge NSW 2037. Lunch will be provided.

Conditions of Play – Sydney NSW 2009

General

1. Entrants shall have a current handicap from -3 to +7. However, the ACA may accept entries from players with a handicap outside this range. The Men's and Women's championship of Australia shall be limited to 48 entries in each event. The ACA reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason and to have final arbitration on any question that may arise.
2. Should an overseas player win an event, any perpetual trophy shall remain in Australia in the custody of the Executive Director of the ACA.
3. Winners of trophies are to obtain a quote for the price of engraving their details on the trophy and submit that quote to the Executive Director of Croquet Australia for approval before proceeding with engraving.
4. All events shall be played under the Laws of Association Croquet (2008), the ACA Regulations for Tournaments (1 January 2009) and Part C of the ACA Handbook (April 2008) unless other provisions have been made.
5. The Interactive World Ranking list from 21 February 2009 shall be used for seeding. The draws shall be made by the ACA Tournament Committee in consultation with the Executive Director and another member of the Executive. The draws shall be conducted using the Seeding and Draw Procedures for ACA Events.
6. Registration shall take place at the first venue of play for each player.
7. Hoops shall be set at 3 11/16 inches with a tolerance $\pm 1/32$ of an inch (ACA Regulation 1(c)(2)).
8. Dawson International Balls approved by the ACA shall be used.
9. The Australian handicapping System shall be in force. Players must ensure that they have their handicap card with them and present them to the authorised person before each event commences. Handicap changes shall be effective after the completion of each event. Any player who fails to show their handicap may be refused entry into an event.
10. Players and officials must wear suitable, predominantly white, sportswear or their approved club or state uniform. Appropriate footwear must be worn. Please note, players and spectators at the Royal Sydney Golf Club must observe all rules and the dress code as set out in the document previously sent to players.
11. The attention of players is drawn to Law 49 regarding *Expedition in Play* and to Condition 65 of the ACA Handbook concerning *Conduct of Players (in the activities of the ACA)*.
12. Any player not in readiness to commence play at the appointed time may be disqualified at the discretion of the Tournament Manager.
13. All competitors shall provide an address or telephone number to the Tournament Manager where messages can be sent to them during the events.
14. The Tournament Manager in consultation with the ACA Executive may make any alterations to the program, draw and other arrangements as are necessary in order to complete the tournament in the time available.

Officials

15. The Tournament Manager is John Eddes who shall be based at the Tournament headquarters.
16. The Tournament Headquarters is Croquet NSW Headquarters, Mackey Park, Tempe.

17. The Tournament referee is Jan Sage.
18. The Tournament handicapper is Tim Murphy.
19. The Results Manager is Brian Smith.

Men's and Women's Singles

20. All matches shall be best of three games unless otherwise specified.
21. The Men's final shall be best of five provided all of Day 4 is free for it.
22. Each best of three shall have a cumulative time limit of 7.5 hours with individual game time limits of 3, 2.5 and 2 hours. Each best of five shall have a cumulative time limit of 12 hours with individual game time limits of 3, 3, 2.5, 2 and 1.5 hours. Time not used in games shall be added to subsequent games. Players are responsible for their own time clocks.
23. If time is called in any game and play continues in terms of Regulation 15(c) the additional time to complete the game shall be excluded from the above-mentioned time limits.
24. No player shall be required to play more than 12 hours or 6 games in one day.
25. Men's: First and second round losers proceed to the Plate. A XYZ shall be played at the round of 16. Losers in the round of 16 play in the Y event. Losers of the quarter-finals play in the Z event. There shall be a play-off for places 3 and 4.
26. Women's: First and second round losers proceed to the Plate. A XYZ shall be played at the round of 8. Losers in the round of 8 play in the Y event. Losers of the semi-finals play in the Z event.
27. Players who are required to change venues during the day will generally be transported to the second venue by private car.

Plate Events

28. Players who may enter the Plate events are as follows:
 - a. Players knocked out in rounds 1 and 2 of the main events;
 - b. Players not allocated a place in the main events;
 - c. Players who are reserves for the main events.
29. Players not entering through the main event shall pay a fee of \$20.
30. The Plate events shall be played initially as blocks (preferably blocks of 8, however, as large as possible within time and court constraints).
31. Round-robin matches shall be single games with 2.25 hour time limits.
32. Rounds 1 to 3 of block play shall be scheduled for the first day of plate play (Day 2) with rounds 4 to 7 on the second day (Day 3). Matches may start immediately that players are available. Players may have to wait for some time between matches due to the timing of players from the second round entering the Plate.
33. At single lawn venues (Hunters Hill & Epping) two players from each block will be required to change venues at the completion of round 5. Two players shall change to the other venue at the start of Day 3. This is dependent on plate block numbers.
34. On Day 4 the finals phase of the Plate events shall be single game semi-finals (if four blocks) and a single game final. If there are three Plate blocks the finals shall be a round-robin between the three block winners. All time limits for the finals phase shall be 3 hours.

Interstate Cup

This event shall be played as per Section 54 of the ACA Handbook.

35. Games shall have a 3 hour time limit.

Australian Medal Event

This event shall be played as per Sections 56 of the ACA Handbook.

36. On Days 1 and 3 (Wednesday and Friday) each player shall play 3 matches and on Day 2 (Thursday) each player shall play 4 matches.

Venues

37. Lawns on which the events are to be played may be open for practice before the events at the discretion of the club concerned. Please check availability with the Tournament Manager.
38. Lawns may be available for practice before commencement of play each day (not later than 7:50am) and after completion of play for the day, subject to club requirements for dressing lawns and maintenance. The Venue Manager's approval must be sought for practice and player assistance in preparing and clearing lawns shall ensure that this practice can continue. During practice before play players are requested to not run hoops in such a manner that the hoops are loosened.
39. Play shall commence at 8am unless otherwise indicated. Players are requested to be at their designated venue at least 10 minutes before the scheduled starting time.
40. Players are generally allowed a break of up to 15 minutes between matches. Players may also have one meal break per day of up to 30 minutes, following the completion of the first game finishing after 11.30am. Venue Managers shall ensure games go on expeditiously to enable completion of the scheduled program. In multiple game matches players commence play in subsequent games immediately upon completion of the previous game, with allowance for a short break for personal issues and recognised meal breaks.
41. Hoops shall be relocated as necessary.
42. A Venue Manager in consultation with the Tournament manager shall decide whether play in any match should continue if the weather is deteriorating.
43. After the toss players are permitted a 5 minute warm-up with the balls to be used in that match and on the court to be used. Players with a bye in round 1 of the Men's or Women's Singles may practice on lawns to be played on for a maximum of 15 minutes after the round 1 match is completed and before the commencement of the 5 minute warm up.
44. There shall be a referee at each venue to act as required.
45. Special damage may be repaired in accordance with Law 34(c).

Weather

46. Play may be suspended if there is water pooling on the surface.
47. The Venue Manager shall instruct the players to cease play immediately if there is lightning in the area. Players must comply. Players and officials should shelter in a safe area.
48. (Croquet NSW Regulation) It is not considered appropriate to use only a specific temperature to consider deferring play, however if, in the opinion of the Venue Manager, a combination of high temperature and high humidity may create a safety issue and a player is affected to such a degree they are unable to continue playing the Venue Manager is empowered to suspend play and consult with the Tournament Manager.
49. The Tournament Manager shall endeavour to reschedule continuation at a later time but given the tight schedule this may not be possible and the player who ceased play may be treated as conceding the game.
50. In the event of extreme weather conditions causing postponement of games they shall be rescheduled at times and venues as appropriate. This may include using a venue with lights.

Arrangements for Players and Visitors at the Royal Sydney Golf Club

1. Dates and Times

Access to the RSGC will be from Wednesday 25th March to Sunday 29th March inclusive

Access will be from about 7.00am for play to commence from 8.00am

Play will normally finish around 6.00pm but may extend to about 7.00pm in unusual circumstances

Some lawns will be available for practice on Tuesday 24th from 1.00pm to 4.00pm.

During practice players will not interfere with any work by the RSGC ground staff.

2. Access and Facilities

Players and spectators may only enter via the car park on Kent Road.

RSGC will place signage to direct players and visitors to the courts.

Parking in the RSGC car park will be available for croquet players and officials, on most occasions.

Parking may be made available to other visitors at the discretion of the RSGC.

The Venue Manager for croquet will be located at the eastern end of the Tennis Pavilion.

The RSGC has the following dress standards.

In the Clubhouse and on All Sporting Facilities

- a. No denim clothing is permitted.
- b. No obvious commercial advertising on clothing.
- c. Men – shoes must be worn with socks.
- d. Access to Clubhouse Sports Bar only – jacket and tie not required, sporting attire acceptable.
- e. Croquet attire to be neat and appropriate. Team uniforms accepted.
- f. Men general: shirts must have collars and must be tucked into trousers or shorts. When wearing shorts, visitors may wear plain calf length white socks. "Cargo" type shorts are not permitted.
- g. Women general: Shorts and skirts should not be shorter than mid-thigh length. Shirts must have collars.

All visitors are requested to comply with the normal dress standard, but in the croquet area only it will not be strictly enforced.

Access to the clubhouse will be limited to the Sports Bar, and is conditional on meeting the above dress standards. There will be a sign-in protocol for players, officials and spectators who wish to use the Sports Bar, but no sign-in is required for those who do not use the clubhouse.

Players, officials and spectators complying with the dress standards may use the Sports Bar for drinks, snacks and the like.

Coffee, soft drinks and sandwiches will be available for purchase at the Tennis Pavilion. These will be to the RSGC normal standards. All purchases must be paid for at the time of purchase. There will be no CNSW account or the like.

Food and beverages are not to be brought to the RSGC by visitors and players. Players who use special sporting diets consumed during the day are exempt.

The RSGC has the following requirements for mobile telephones

- a. Mobile telephones are not permitted in the Clubhouse or on the sporting facilities, and must be switched off in these locations.
- b. The use of a mobile telephone within the confines of a car, parked in the Car Park, is permitted
- c. Mobile telephones may be used when inside the Tennis Pavilion, and players and visitors are requested to then use their telephones sparingly.
