

**AUSTRALIAN ASSOCIATION CROQUET HANDICAPS  
HOBART, TASMANIA**

**HANDICAP SINGLES and DOUBLES  
25 - 31 OCTOBER 2010**

**SPECIFIC CONDITIONS OF PLAY**

Tournament Headquarters is Sandy Bay Croquet Club. Other clubs will be used as necessary including New Town, Kingston, and Eastern Shore. Programs will be available on Registration (which takes place at the Welcome function).

**Association Croquet Handicap Singles**

1. The Association Croquet Handicap Singles is generally limited to 64 players.
2. The Draw was is conducted by the Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committee using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures within 3 days of entries closing. The ranking list current at that time was used for seeding purposes. The format for the Handicap Singles is as follows.
  - a) Blocks seeded with members of the same family placed in different blocks, and players from the same State evenly spread between blocks. Each player to play each other player in the block in a single game.
  - b) Based on games and then net points, an equal number of players from each block will proceed to the quarter-finals (knockout phase) of the event. If players are still tied then the players concerned will play a shortened game to determine the winner, or other method at the Tournament Manager's discretion.
  - c) Players will be re-seeded for the knock-out phase based on final placings in initial blocks.
  - d) All games will be single life, with a 2.5 hour time limit.

**Association Croquet Handicap Doubles**

1. The Association Croquet Handicap Doubles is generally limited to 32 pairs.
2. The Draw is conducted by the Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committee using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures within 3 days of entries closing. The ranking list current at that time was used for seeding purposes. The format for the Handicap Doubles is as follows.
  - a) Blocks seeded with members of the same family placed in different blocks, and pairs from the same State evenly spread between blocks. Each pair to play each other pair in the block in a single game.
  - b) Based on games and then net points, an equal number of pairs from each block will proceed to the semi-finals (knockout phase) of the event. If pairs are still tied then the pairs concerned will play a shortened game to determine the winner, or other method at the Tournament Manager's discretion.
  - c) Pairs will be re-seeded for the knock-out phase based on final placings in initial blocks.
  - d) All games will be single-life, with a 2.5 hour time limit.
