**Australian Golf Croquet Open Doubles Championship** - Saturday 15 May – Tuesday 18 May 2010 at Newcastle National Park and Maitland Croquet Clubs. The Plate event will be held at Toronto CC.

**Australian Golf Croquet Open Singles Championship** - Wednesday 19 May – Sunday 23 May 2010 at Newcastle National Park and Maitland CCs. The Plate event will be held at Toronto CC.

### **Registration**

**STANDARD CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR ACA GOLF CROQUET EVENTS**

1. All events will be played under the WCF Rules of Golf Croquet adopted by Croquet Australia.
2. The Australian Handicapping System is in force for this Tournament, and entrants are to have a current Golf Croquet handicap. A handicap may be assigned by the Tournament Manager in terms of the Appendix to the Rules of Golf Croquet.
3. Players are to ensure that they have their ACA Handicap Cards with them to present to the Tournament Manager or his representative before each event commences. Handicap cards should be completed after each game. If players reach a trigger point their handicap changes immediately.
4. Croquet Australia reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason and to have final arbitration on any question that may arise.
5. All competitors who have not already provided an address, telephone number or email address at which messages can reach them during the events should provide this information during registration.
6. Courts will be available for practice up to 7.45am each day and after the completion of play for the day, subject to club requirements for dressing courts and maintenance. The Venue Manager's approval should be sought for such practice, and players assistance in preparing and clearing lawns will ensure that this practice can continue.
7. Hoops are to be set as near as possible to 3 11/16 inches. To allow for inaccuracies in gauges, balls, hoops and setting techniques, a tolerance of  $\pm 1/32$  inch is allowed. Players are asked to help set the hoops if necessary.
8. Hoops may be reset at any time on the request of the player in play. In double-banked games, hoops may be reset on the request of a player in play subject to approval of the double-banked player on court. The double-banked player on court may not reasonably withhold permission unless they are about to use the hoop which is to be reset.
9. Dawson International balls will be used.
10. Players are requested to assist in setting the hoops at the start of the day if necessary.
11. Court allocations may be changed by the Venue Manager and games will be double banked as required.
12. There will be a Referee at each court to act as required. Where there are not sufficient referees present to be in charge of all games, referees will be supervisory.
13. Players' attention is drawn to Rule 14 of the WCF Golf Croquet Rules book regarding Etiquette, which also covers expedition in play and to Condition 65 of the ACA Handbook concerning Conduct of Players in ACA events.
14. Players are required to wear predominantly white clothing and appropriate footwear. Club, State or National Uniforms are also permitted. Predominantly white clothing means any article with more than 75% of its surface area white. White means white, not grey or off-white (this condition does not apply to wet weather clothing hats or caps). Any player presenting at the venue in clothing that does not meet this criteria will be given the opportunity to dress appropriately or will not be permitted to participate in the event. The Executive Committee may amend these rules if necessary. Flat-soled footwear must be worn.
15. Matches shall commence at **8.00 am** sharp unless otherwise indicated. Players are requested to be at their designated court before the scheduled starting time.
16. All games will be un-timed. However, the Tournament or Venue Manager may impose a time limit if necessary.
17. Players are allowed a break of up to 5 minutes between matches and a lunch break of up to 30 minutes, but such breaks can be waived by mutual agreement of the players. No break is allowed between games in multiple game matches - games should be 'seamless' and players are expected to commence play in the second and third games immediately after the completion of the previous game. The Tournament and Venue Managers will ensure games go on expeditiously to enable completion of the scheduled program.
18. It is mandatory for players to inform the Tournament Manager if they wish to leave the venue for any reason.
19. The Venue Manager will decide whether play in any match should continue if the weather is deteriorating.

20. The Tournament Manager in consultation with the Executive of Croquet Australia may make any alterations to the program, draw and other arrangements as are necessary in order to complete the tournament in the time available. If available, lights may be used at the Tournament or Venue Manager's discretion.
21. An appeals committee under ACA comprising the Tournament Manager, the Tournament Referee and a member of the ACA Executive (or nominated representative) shall determine any matters that are in dispute during the course of the tournament.
22. Should an overseas player win an event, the perpetual trophy shall remain in Australia in the custody of the Executive Director of Croquet Australia. All winners of trophies are requested to obtain a quote for the cost of appropriate engraving and submit that quote to the Executive Director of Croquet Australia before proceeding.

### **SPECIFIC CONDITIONS OF PLAY**

Tournament Headquarters is Newcastle National Park (4 courts). Other clubs will be used as necessary including Maitland (4 courts) and the plate will be played at Toronto (4 courts). Programs will be available on the ACA website, plus limited hard copies at Registration at Newcastle National Park CC on Friday 14 May between 12 - 4.30 pm.

#### **Golf Croquet Open Doubles Championship of Australia (15 – 18 May 2010)**

1. The Open Doubles Golf Croquet Championship of Australia is generally limited to 32 pairs.
2. The Draw was conducted by the Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committee using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures. The ranking list current at that time was used for seeding purposes. The format for the Open Doubles is as follows.
  - a) Blocks seeded with members of the same family placed in different blocks, and pairs from the same State evenly spread between blocks. Each pair to play each other pair in the block in a single life 13 point game.
  - b) Pairs placed 1 to 4 in each block based on games won will proceed to the quarter finals. If pairs are tied on games won then placings will be determined on net points, or other method at the Tournament Manager's discretion.
  - c) Pairs will be drawn for the Quarter Finals based on final placings in initial blocks. The knockout will be played as best of three 13 point matches, with the Final played as best of five 13 point matches (time permitting).
  - d) A Plate event may be conducted (if time) as blocks or Swiss with a single life knockout final. Players may enter the Plate event as follows:
    - i. players not allocated a place in the main events, and,
    - ii. players who are reserves in the main events, and,
    - iii. players entering the Plate Event directly (not through the main event).

#### **Golf Croquet Open Singles Championship of Australia (19 – 23 May 2010)**

1. The Open Singles Golf Croquet Championship of Australia is generally limited to 64 players.
2. The Draw was conducted by the Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committee using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures. The ranking list current at that time was used for seeding purposes. The format for the Open Singles is as follows.
  - a) Blocks seeded with members of the same family placed in different blocks, and players from the same State evenly spread between blocks. Each player to play each other player in the block twice in single 13 point matches.
  - b) Players placed 1 to 4 in each block based on games won will proceed to the final 16 knockout stage of the event. If players are tied then they will play a 13 point game to determine the winner if time permits, otherwise placings will be determined by net points, or other method at the Tournament Manager's discretion.
  - c) Players will be drawn for the knock-out phase based on final placings in initial blocks. The knockout will be played as best of three 13 point matches, with the Final played as best of five 13 point matches (time permitting)..
  - d) The Plate event will be conducted as large blocks or Swiss with a single life knockout final. Players may enter the Plate event as follows:
    - i. players not allocated a place in the main events, and,
    - ii. players who are reserves in the main events, and,
    - iii. players entering the Plate Event directly (not through the main event).

### **Details for Round Robin Block Play - Doubles**

1. Games commence at 8.00 am **sharp** each day.
2. Games will be double banked as required. All games must start from corner 4.  
A second game starting on a lawn is not to start until the previous game has cleared the second hoop.
3. Games will be un-timed (see Conditions of Play, point 16)
4. Games are single life 13 point games.
5. Players are requested to ensure that they are prepared to have lunch and breaks when time permits.
6. In both blocks sessions 1 to 6 will be played on Saturday (Day 1), and the remaining 3 or 5 sessions will be played on Sunday (Day 2).
7. Players finishing 1 – 4 in each block will qualify for the knock-out, as per Doubles condition 2(b).
8. The knockout will be announced following completion of all games on Day 2.  
The 8 pairs who qualify will play in the knockout, as per Doubles condition 2(c).
9. The remaining players shall proceed to the Plate Event.

### **The Doubles Plate Event**

10. The Plate Event will be conducted at Toronto Croquet Club.
11. Games will be conducted as a Round Robin at the discretion of the Tournament Manager. The winner and runner up of each block will advance to semi-finals and finals.

### **The Doubles Knockout**

12. The knockout will be conducted in 3 rounds with best of three 13 point matches, except that the Final will be a best of five 13 point match if time permits.
13. Round 1 of the knockout and the Semi Finals will be played on Monday (Day 3) at Newcastle National Park.
14. The losers from round 1 proceed to a Y event in round 2
15. The X & Y Finals will be played on Tuesday (Day 4) at Newcastle National Park.
16. Games will be un-timed (see Conditions of Play, point 16).

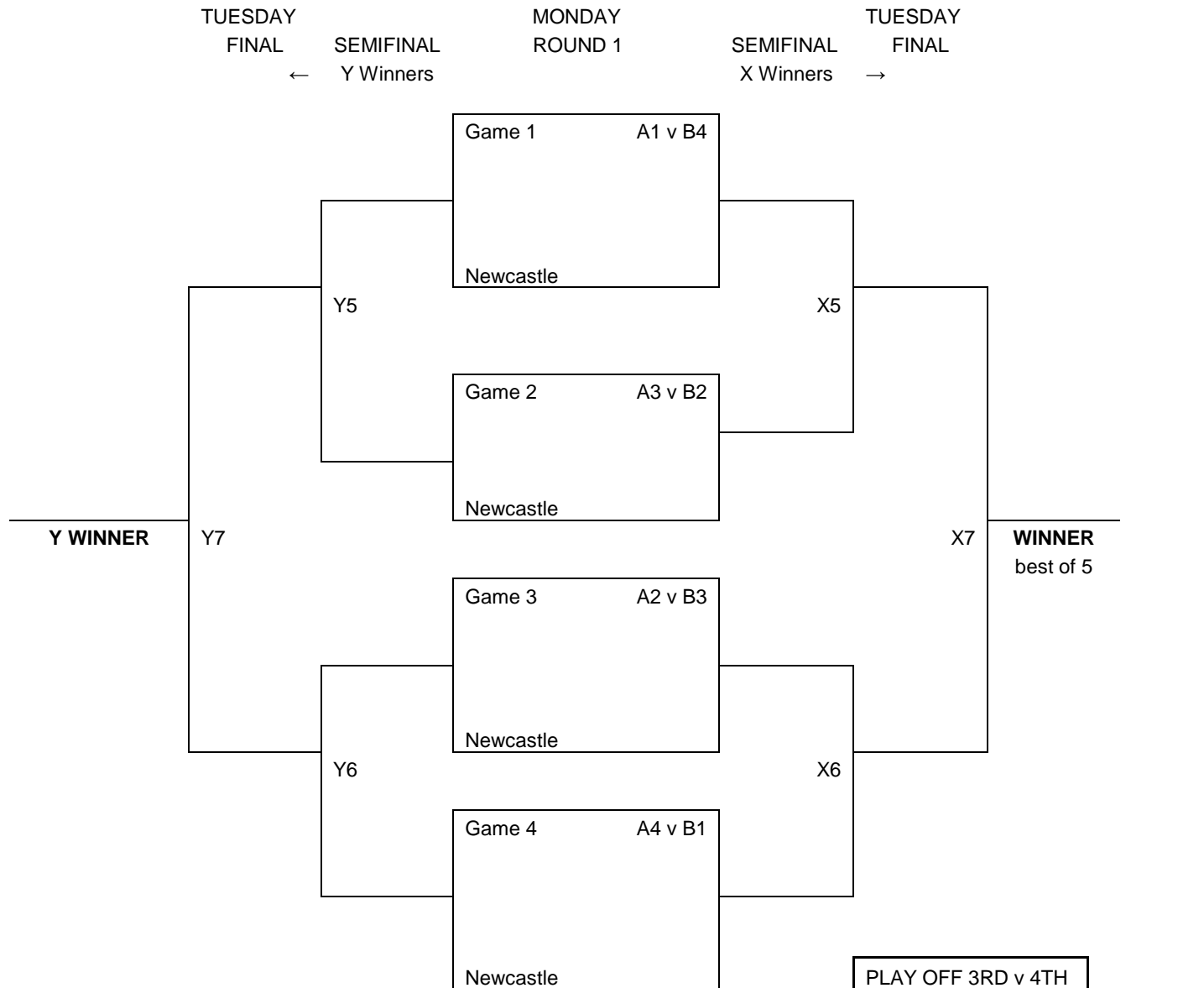

### **Details for Round Robin Block Play - Singles**

1. Games commence at 8.00 am **sharp** each day.
2. Games will be double banked as required. All games must start from corner 4.  
A second game starting on a lawn is not to start until the previous game has cleared the second hoop.
3. Games will be un-timed (see Conditions of Play, point 16)
4. Games are single life 13 point games.
5. Handicap cards should be completed after each game.  
If players reach a trigger point their handicap changes immediately.
6. Players are requested to ensure that they are prepared to have lunch and breaks when time permits.
7. Sessions 1 to 8 will be played on the first day, sessions 9 to 16 on the second day, and the remaining sessions on the third day. Players may play more sessions on each day if conditions permit, at the Venue Manager's discretion, but no game will start after 4pm.
8. Note that, although each player will play each other player in their block twice, these are separate matches - except that the loser of the toss in the first match will change colours and hit off first in the second match.
9. Players finishing 1 – 4 in each block will qualify for the knock-out, as per Singles condition 2(b).
10. The knockout will be announced following completion of all games on Day 3. The 16 players who qualify will play in the knockout, as per Singles condition 2(c).
11. The remaining players shall proceed to the Plate Event.

### **The Plate Event**

12. The Plate Event will be conducted at Toronto Croquet Club.
13. Games will be conducted as a Round Robin at the discretion of the Tournament Manager. The winner and runner up of each block will advance to semi-finals and finals.

### **The Knockout**

14. The knockout will be conducted in 4 rounds with best of three 13 point matches, except that the Final will be a best of five 13 point match if time permits.
15. Rounds 1 and 2 will be played on Saturday (Day 4 of the Open Singles Event).
16. Rounds 3 and 4 will be played on Sunday (Day 5) along with the playoff for Third & Fourth.
17. Games will be un-timed (see Conditions of Play, point 16).
18. Some matches in the first 2 rounds will be double-banked.
19. The 8 losers from Round 1 proceed to a Y Event in Round 2.
20. The 4 losers from round 2 in the X event will proceed to the Z event.
21. The Semi-finals and Finals of the X, Y and Z will be played on Day 5.

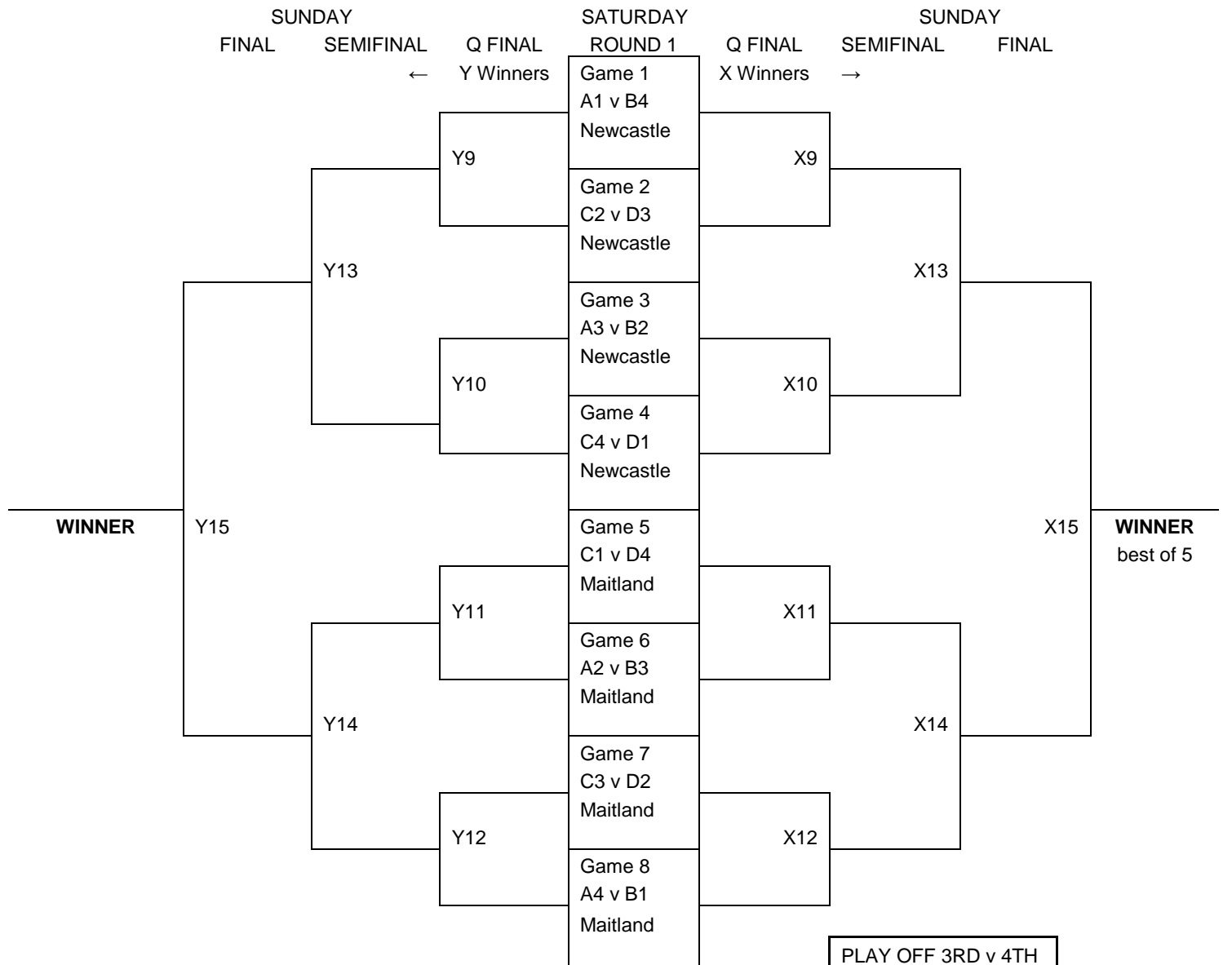

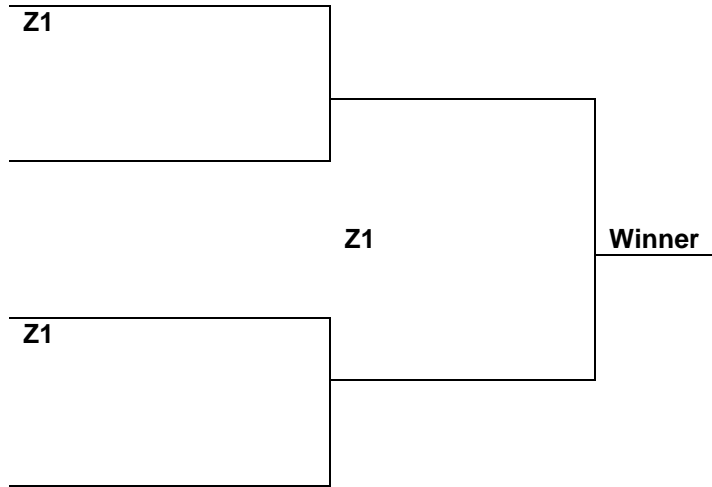
