Australian Women's Singles Championship - Saturday 19 to Tuesday 22 March in Hobart at New Town (2 courts), Eastern Shore (2 courts) and Kingston (2 courts) Croquet Clubs.

Australian Men's Singles Championship - Saturday 19 to Tuesday 22 March in Launceston at the Northern Tasmania Croquet Centre (St Leonards, 6 courts) and the Royal Park (1 court) and East Launceston (1 court) Croquet Clubs.

Interstate Cup (Eire Cup) - Wednesday 23 to Sunday 27 March in Hobart, at Sandy Bay (3 courts), Tarooma Bowls Club (1 court), Eastern Shore (2 courts), Kingston (2 courts), New Town (3 courts) and Buckingham Bowls Club (1 court).

The Women's and Men's Championships will also have a Plate event.

The AGM will be held on Monday 28 March at 10am at the Eastern Shore CC. Lunch will be provided.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY Tasmania 2011

General

1. All events will be played under the Laws of Association Croquet, sixth edition, amended 2008, adopted by Croquet Australia and Australian Tournament Regulations as amended on 30 March 2010, and including the new Refereeing Regulations adopted on 15 Feb 2011.
2. All competitors who have not already provided an address, phone number and/or email address for messages can reach them during the events should provide this information to the Tournament Manager during registration.
3. Tournament Headquarters is the New Town Croquet Club (and the Northern Tasmanian Croquet Centre for the Men's event). Programs will be available at Registration.
4. Courts may be available for practice up to 7.50am each day, when hoops may only be run in a controlled fashion, and after the completion of play for the day (at the discretion of the Venue Manager).
5. Hoops will be set as near as possible to 3 11/16 inches. To allow for inaccuracies in gauges, balls, hoops and setting techniques, a tolerance of $\pm 1/32$ inch is allowed.
6. Players are requested to assist in setting the hoops at the start of the day if necessary.
7. Any player is entitled to have equipment checked at any time. In double-banked games, hoops may be reset on the request of the player in play subject to approval of the double-banked player on court. The double-banked player on court may not reasonably withhold permission unless he is in a break within 3 hoops of a hoop which is to be reset.
8. Dawson International balls will be used.
9. Courts will be allocated by the Venue Manager and games will be double banked as required.
10. A 5 minute warm up period will be permitted before a player's first game of the day when hoops may only be run in a controlled fashion. This is subject to the tournament schedule.
11. Matches shall commence at **8.00 am** sharp unless otherwise indicated. Players are requested to be at their designated court before the scheduled starting time.
12. Referees will be Referees on Request in accordance with new Regulation R1(a)(2).
13. Players may be allowed a break of up to 10 minutes between matches and a lunch break of up to 30 minutes. No break is allowed between games of multiple game matches. The Tournament Manager will ensure games go on expeditiously to enable completion of the scheduled program.
14. It is mandatory for players to inform the Venue Manager should they wish to leave the venue for any reason.
15. Players and officials must wear suitable, predominately white sportswear or their approved club, state or national uniform. Enclosed flat-soled footwear must be worn. These conditions will be enforced.
16. The Venue Manager will decide whether play in any match should continue if the weather is deteriorating.
17. The Tournament Manager in consultation with the Executive of Croquet Australia may make any alterations to the program, draw and other arrangements as necessary to complete the tournament in the time available. If available, lights may be used at the Tournament or Venue Manager's discretion to achieve the schedule.
18. Special damage may be repaired in accordance with Law 34(c).
19. Players' attention is drawn to Law 49 regarding Expedition in Play.
20. Players' and spectators' attention is drawn to ACA Regulation 25, and Clause 65A of the ACA Handbook re Conduct of Spectators.
21. The Australian Handicapping System is used for this Tournament. Players must ensure that they have their handicap cards with them and present them to the authorised person before the Open Singles. The Tournament Handicapper may amend a player's handicap before the commencement of play where there is a significant inconsistency between players of similar world ranking grade. Handicap changes will be effective after completion of any game in which players pass a trigger point (in accordance with the updated Handicapping Regulations published on the ACA Website on 14 February 2010).
22. An appeals committee comprising the Tournament Manager, the appropriate Tournament Referee and a member of the ACA Executive (or nominated representative) shall determine any matters that are in dispute during the course of the tournament.
23. Winners of trophies are to obtain a quote for the price of engraving their details on the trophy and submit this to the Executive Director of Croquet Australia for approval before proceeding with engraving.
24. Should an overseas player win an event, any perpetual trophy shall remain in Australia in the custody of the Executive Director of the ACA.

Men's and Women's Singles

25. The draw was conducted by the ACA Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committees on 11 March 2011 using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures and the World Ranking List as at 10 March 2011.
26. The format is single life knockout. All matches except the Men's & Women's final shall be best of three games unless otherwise specified. The Men's & Women's final shall be best of five, provided all of Day 4 is free for them.
27. Players having a bye in first rounds will have 15 minute warm up with four balls before playing their first game.
28. Each best of three shall have a cumulative time limit of 7.5 hours with individual game time limits of 3, 2.5 and 2 hours plus Reg.15 (c). Each best of five shall have a cumulative time limit of 12 hours with individual game time limits of 3, 2.5, 2.5, 2 and 2 hours plus Reg.15 (c). Time not used in games shall be added to subsequent games. Players are responsible for their own time clocks.
29. If time is called in any game and play continues in terms of Regulation 15(c) the additional time to complete the game shall be excluded from the above-mentioned time limits.
30. No player shall be required to play more than 12 hours or 6 games in one day.
31. Alternative venues may be used if necessary.
32. Men's: First and second round losers proceed to the Plate. An XYZ shall be played at the round of 16. Losers in the round of 16 play in the Y event. Losers of the quarter-finals play in the Z event. Losers of semi finals play off for 3 – 4.
33. Women's: First and second round losers proceed to the Plate. An XYZ shall be played at the round of 8. Losers in the round of 8 play in the Y event. Losers of semi finals play in the Z event, for 3 – 4.
34. Players who are required to change venues during the day will generally be transported to the second venue by private car.

Plate Events

35. Players who may enter the Plate events are as follows:
 - a. Players knocked out in rounds 1 or 2 of the main events;
 - b. Players not allocated a place in the main events;
 - c. Players who are reserves for the main events.
36. Players entering the Plate Events only will pay 50% of the entry fee.
37. The Plate event will be played either in large blocks (as large as possible within time and court constraints), or as a Swiss event, at the Tournament Manager's discretion.
38. Matches shall be single games with 2.5 hour time limits plus Reg.15 (c).
39. The Plate may start immediately players (and Courts) become available. Players may have to wait for some time between matches due to the timing of players from the second round entering the Plate.

Interstate Cup

40. This event shall be played as per Section 54 of the ACA Handbook. Games shall have a 3 hour time limit plus Reg.15 (c).

Australian Medal Event

41. This event shall be played as per Section 56 of the ACA Handbook, as a double round robin of single games. On Days 1 and 3 (Wednesday and Friday) each player shall play 3 matches, and on Day 2 (Thursday) each player shall play 4 matches. All games will be untimed subject to ACA Regulation 15.

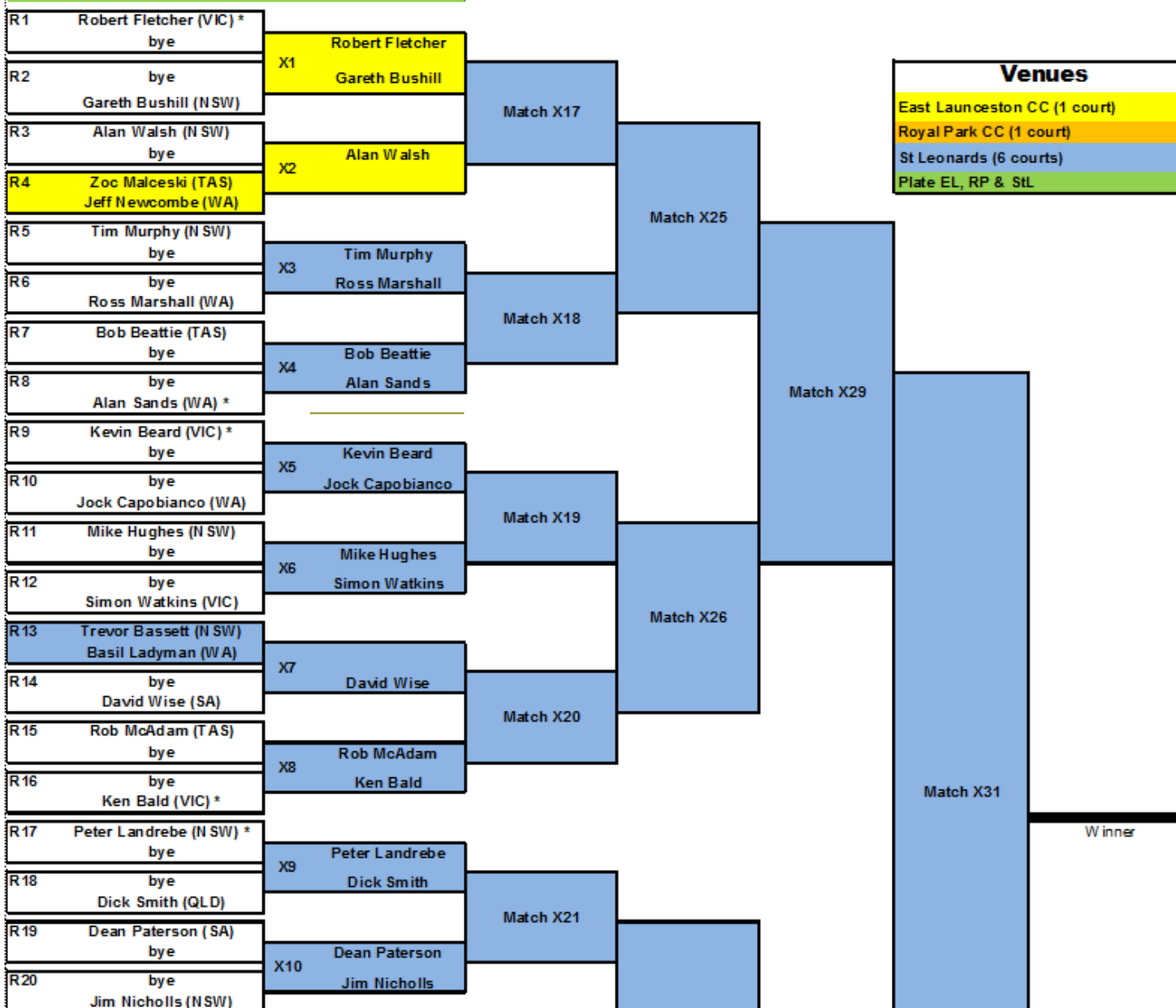

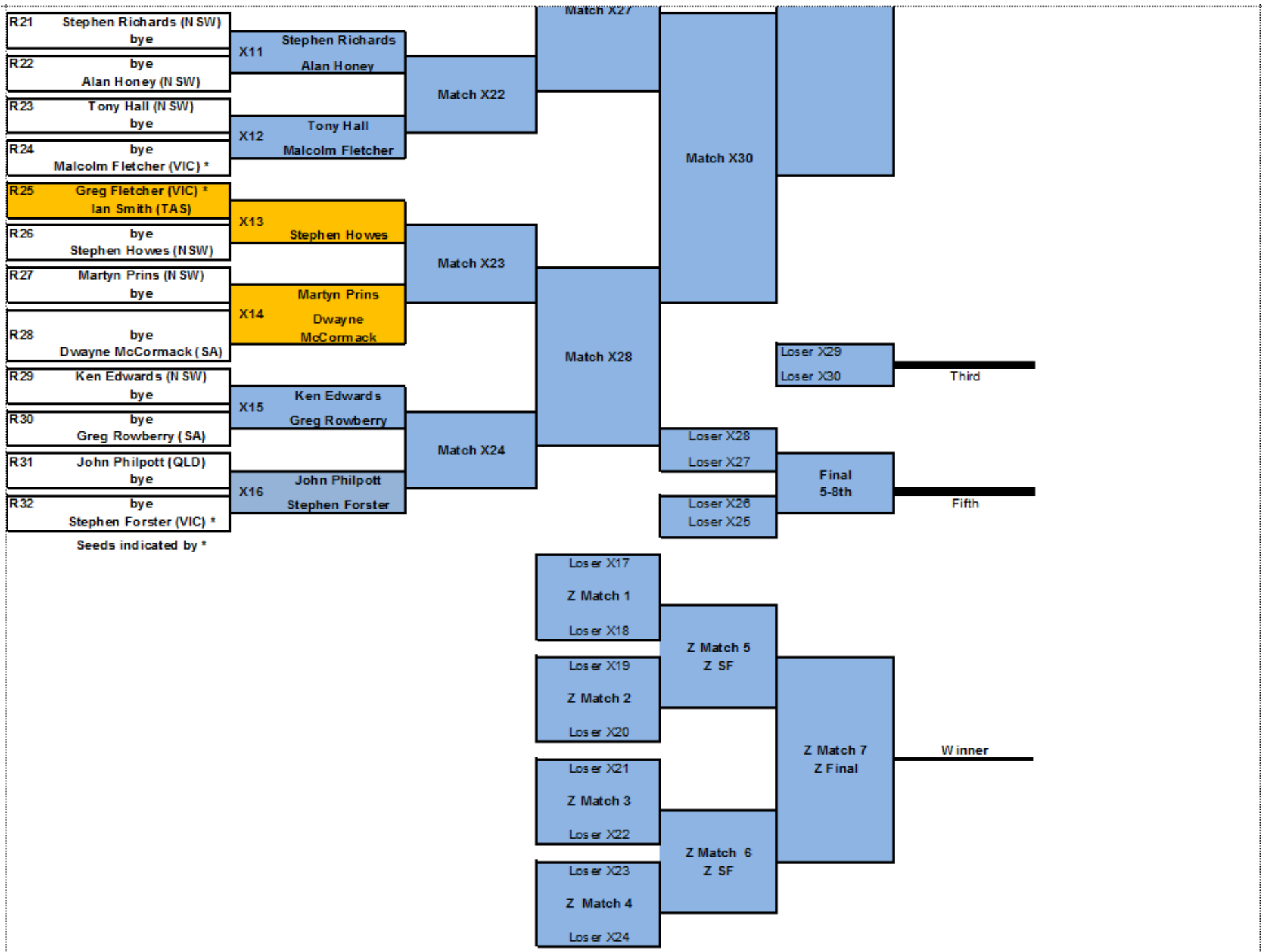
