Australian Golf Croquet Handicap Singles (Holder: Glenn Foley)

17-19 October. Entries are limited to 64 players in order of receipt. Play will commence in seeded blocks (up to 8 players per block). Qualifying players will be re-seeded for the knock-out phase. Matches will be single 13-point games except that knock-outs will be best-of-3 if time allows. Players are expected to play up to 7 games per day. Matches will be untimed, except that the manager may impose a time limit if necessary. A plate will be conducted for players eliminated from the knock-out.

Australian Golf Croquet Handicap Doubles (Holders: Clive Faulkner & Doug Fortescue)

15 and 16 October. Entries are limited to 64 individual players (to make 32 pairs) in order of receipt. Partners are allocated on a high/low handicap basis. Mutual requests for a preferred partner will normally be granted if the partnership satisfies the high/low handicap requirement. Play will commence in seeded blocks (up to 8 pairs per block). Qualifying pairs will be re-seeded for the knock out phase. Matches are single 13-point games except for knock-outs which will be best-of-3 if time permits. Matches will be untimed, except that the manager may impose a time limit if necessary. A plate will be conducted for pairs eliminated from the knock-out.
