**Australian Golf Croquet Open Doubles Championship** - Saturday 14 May – Tuesday 17 May 2011 at Tempe and Sutherland CCs. The Plate event will be held at Sutherland CC.

**Australian Golf Croquet Open Singles Championship** - Wednesday 18 May – Sunday 22 May 2011 at Chatswood (3 courts), Killara (2 courts), and Mosman (4 courts) CCs. The Plate event will be at Cammeray and Chatswood CCs.

**STANDARD CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR ACA GOLF CROQUET EVENTS**

1. All events will be played under the WCF Rules of Golf Croquet adopted by Croquet Australia.
2. The Australian Handicapping System is in force for this Tournament, and entrants are to have a current Golf Croquet handicap. A handicap may be assigned by the Tournament Manager in terms of the Appendix to the Rules of Golf Croquet.
3. Players are to ensure that they have their ACA Handicap Cards with them to present to the Tournament Manager or their representative before each event commences. Handicap cards should be completed after each game of singles. If players reach a trigger point their handicap changes immediately.
4. All competitors who have not already provided an address, telephone number or email address at which messages can reach them during the events should provide this information during registration.
5. Courts will be available for practice each day until 15 minutes before start times, and after the completion of play for the day, subject to club requirements for dressing courts and maintenance. The Venue Manager's approval should be sought for such practice, and players assistance in preparing and clearing lawns will ensure that this practice can continue.
6. Hoops are to be set as near as possible to 3 11/16 inches. To allow for inaccuracies in gauges, balls, hoops and setting techniques, a tolerance of  $\pm 1/32$  inch is allowed. Players are asked to help set the hoops at the start of the day if necessary.
7. Hoops may be reset at any time on the request of the player in play. In double-banked games, hoops may be reset on the request of a player in play subject to approval of the double-banked player on court. The double-banked player on court may not reasonably withhold permission unless they are about to use the hoop which is to be reset.
8. Dawson International balls will be used.
9. Court allocations may be changed by the Venue Manager and games will be double banked as required.
10. There will be a Referee at each court to act as required. Where there are not sufficient referees present to be in charge of all games, referees will be supervisory.
11. Players' attention is drawn to Rule 14 of the WCF Golf Croquet Rules book regarding Etiquette, which also covers expedition in play and to Condition 65 of the ACA Handbook concerning Conduct of Players in ACA events.
12. Players are required to wear predominantly white clothing and appropriate footwear. Club, State or National Uniforms are also permitted. Predominantly white clothing means any article with more than 75% of its surface area white. White means white, not grey or off-white (this condition does not apply to wet weather clothing, hats or caps). Any player presenting at the venue in clothing that does not meet these criteria will be given the opportunity to dress appropriately or will not be permitted to participate in the event. The Executive Committee may amend these rules if necessary. Flat-soled footwear must be worn.
13. Matches shall commence at **8.00 am** sharp for singles and **8.30 am** for doubles unless otherwise indicated. Venue Managers may change the start time for Days 2 & 3 of the singles, if all 3 matches for Day 1 have been completed. Players are requested to be at their designated court before the scheduled starting time.
14. All games will start un-timed. However, the Tournament or Venue Manager may impose a time limit if necessary.
15. Players are allowed a joint 5 minutes of practice on the court allocated, before each match, but should avoid players already using the court.
16. Players are allowed a break of up to 5 minutes between matches and a lunch break of up to 30 minutes, but such breaks can be waived by mutual agreement of the players. No break is allowed between games in multiple game matches - games should be 'seamless' and players are expected to commence play in the second and third games immediately after the completion of the previous game. The Tournament and Venue Managers will ensure games go on expeditiously to enable completion of the scheduled program.
17. It is mandatory for players to inform the Tournament Manager if they wish to leave the venue for any reason.
18. The Venue Manager will decide whether play in any match should continue if the weather is deteriorating.

19. The Tournament Manager in consultation with the Executive of Croquet Australia may make any alterations to the program, draw and other arrangements as are necessary in order to complete the tournament in the time available. If available, lights may be used at the Tournament or Venue Manager's discretion.
20. An appeals committee under ACA comprising the Tournament Manager, the Tournament Referee and a member of the ACA Executive (or nominated representative) shall determine any matters that are in dispute during the course of the tournament.
21. Should an overseas player win an event, the perpetual trophy shall remain in Australia in the custody of the Executive Director of Croquet Australia. All winners of trophies are requested to obtain a quote for the cost of appropriate engraving and submit that quote to the Executive Director of Croquet Australia before proceeding.

### **SPECIFIC CONDITIONS OF PLAY**

Tournament Headquarters are Tempe (3 courts) for the Doubles, and Chatswood (3 courts) for the Singles. Other clubs will be used as necessary. Programs will be available on the ACA website, plus a hard copy for each player at Registration at Tempe on Friday 13 May between 5-7pm.

#### **Golf Croquet Open Doubles Championship of Australia (14 – 17 May 2011)**

1. The Draw was conducted by the Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committee using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures. The ranking list current at close of entry was used for seeding purposes. The format for the Open Doubles is as follows.
  - a) Blocks were seeded with members of the same family placed in different blocks, and pairs from the same State evenly spread between blocks. Each pair to play each other pair in the block twice, as a double round robin, each being a single 19 point game. The event will be played under the WCF GC Rules except that the winners of the toss in the first block game will be deemed to have lost the toss in the second game against the same opponents.
  - b) Pairs placed 1 to 4 in each block based on games won will proceed to the quarter finals. If pairs are tied on games won then placings will be determined on net points, then result of the games between the pairs, or other method at the Tournament Manager's discretion.
  - c) Pairs will be drawn for the Quarter Finals based on final placings in initial blocks. The knockout will be played as best of three 13 point games, with the Final played as best of five 13 point games (time permitting).
  - d) A Plate event will be conducted, as blocks or Swiss at the Tournament Manager's discretion.

#### **Golf Croquet Open Singles Championship of Australia (18 – 22 May 2011)**

1. The Draw was conducted by the Executive Director in conjunction with the ACA Tournament and Selection Committee using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures. The ranking list current at close of entry was used for seeding purposes. The format for the Open Singles is as follows.
  - a) Blocks were seeded with members of the same family placed in different blocks, and players from the same State evenly spread between blocks. Each player to play each other player in the block in one match, being a best of three 13 point games.
  - b) Players placed 1 to 4 in each block based on matches won will proceed to the final 16 knockout stage of the event. If players are tied on matches, then placings will be determined by net games, then net points, then who won the match between them.
  - c) Players will be drawn for the knock-out phase based on final placings in initial blocks. The knockout will be played as best of three 13 point games, with the Final played as best of five 13 point games (time permitting).
  - d) A Plate event will be conducted, as blocks or Swiss at the Tournament Manager's discretion.

### **Details for Round Robin Block Play - Doubles**

- 1 Matches commence at **8.30 am sharp** each day. Please be early to help set up.
- 2 Games will be double banked as required. All games must start from corner 4.  
A second game starting on a lawn is not to start until the previous game has cleared the second hoop.
- 3 Games will not be timed, unless necessary (see Conditions of Play, point 14)
- 4 Matches are single 19 point games [see GC Rules 2007 1(d)], played as a double round robin.  
The event will be played under the WCF GC Rules except that the winner of the toss in the first block game will be deemed to have lost the toss in the second game against the same opponent.
- 5 Players are requested to ensure that they are prepared to have lunch and breaks when time permits.
- 6 Both blocks play the first round on Saturday (Day 1), and the remaining round on Sunday (Day 2).  
Note that the blocks swap venues between these days.
- 7 Players finishing 1 – 4 in each block will qualify for the knock-out, as per Doubles condition 2(b).
- 8 The knockout will be announced following completion of all games on Day 2.  
The 8 pairs who qualify will play in the knockout, as per Doubles condition 2(c).
- 9 The remaining players may proceed to the Plate Event, along with the Plate direct entries.

### **The Doubles Knockout**

- 10 The knockout will be conducted in 3 rounds with best of three 13 point games, except that the Final will be a best of five 13 point games if time permits.
- 11 Round 1 of the knockout and the Semi Finals will be played on Monday (Day 3) at Tempe.
- 12 The losers from round 1 proceed to a Y event in round 2, at Tempe.
- 13 The X & Y Finals will be played on Tuesday (Day 4) at Tempe.
- 14 Games will not be timed, unless necessary (see Conditions of Play, point 14).

### **The Doubles Plate Event**

- 15 The Plate Event will be conducted at Sutherland Croquet Club.
- 16 The Plate will be conducted as a single block, playing Round Robin or Swiss, at the discretion of the Tournament Manager.

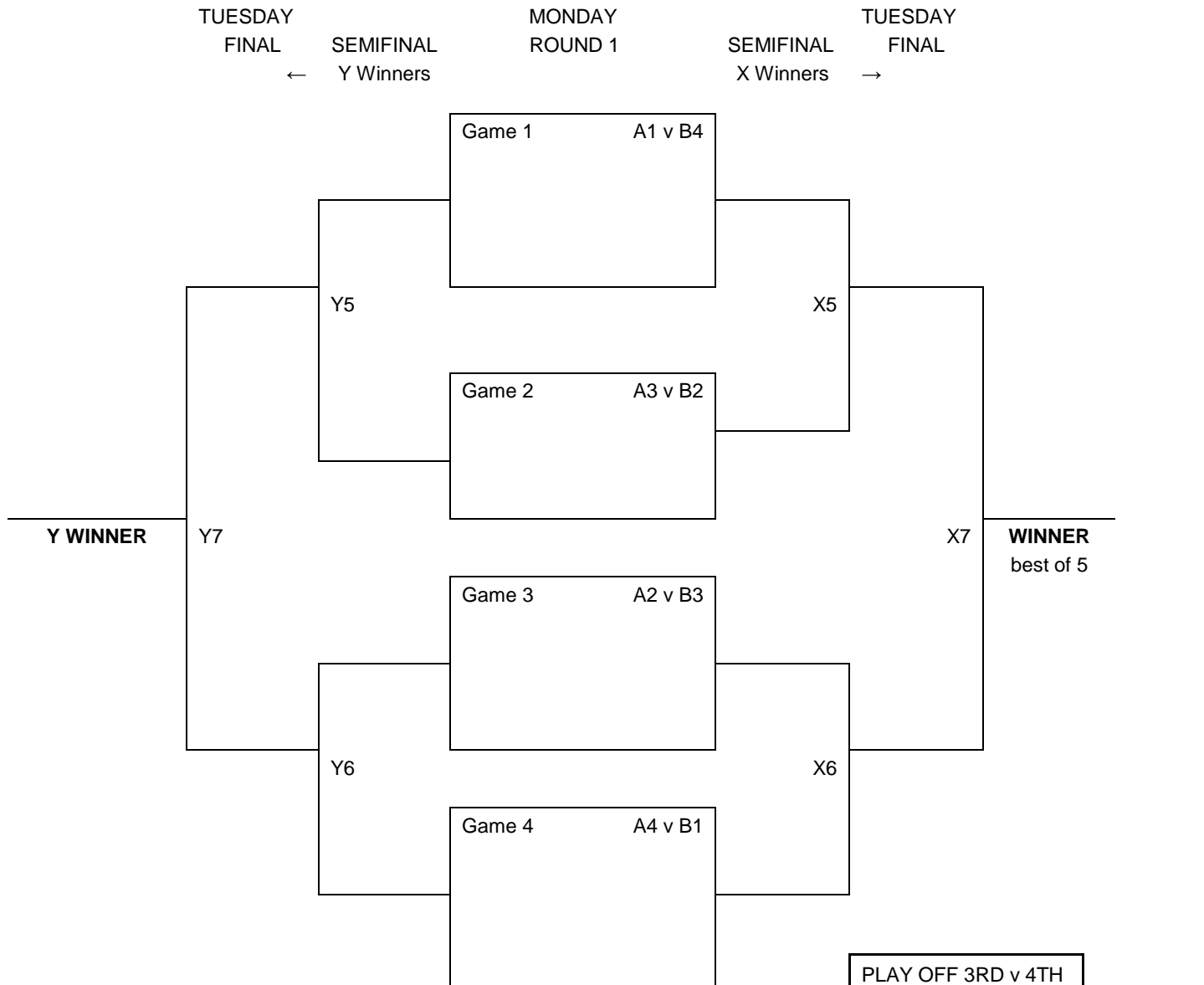

### **Details for Block Play - Singles**

1. Matches commence at 8.00 am **sharp** each day; but starting times for Days 2 & 3 may be altered by the Venue Manager.
2. Games will be double banked as required. All games must start from corner 4.  
A second game on a lawn is not to start until the previous game has cleared at least the second hoop.
3. Games will not be timed, unless necessary (see Conditions of Play, point 14)
4. Matches are single life, best of three 13 point games.
5. Handicap cards should be completed after each match.  
If players reach a trigger point their handicap changes immediately after that game.
6. Players are requested to ensure that they are prepared to have lunch and breaks when time permits between matches. Play within a match is meant to be continuous, and only essential breaks should be taken during a match, and especially between games in a match.
7. Blocks will play sessions 1 to 3 on the first day, sessions 4 & 5 on the second day, and sessions 6 & 7 on the third day. If matches cannot be finished, they will resume after the scheduled sessions on subsequent days
8. Players may decline to play more than 7 games on any day.
9. Players may play more sessions on each day if conditions permit, at the Venue Manager's discretion, but it is intended that matches be played as one continuous session.
10. Players finishing 1 – 4 in each block will qualify for the knock-out, as per Singles condition 2(b).
11. The knockout will be announced following completion of all games on Day 3. The 16 players who qualify will play in the knockout, as per Singles condition 2(c).
12. The remaining players may proceed to the Plate Event, along with the Plate direct entries.

### **The Knockout**

13. The knockout will be conducted in 4 rounds with best of three 13 point games, except that the Final will be a best of five 13 point game match if time permits.
14. Rounds 1 and 2 will be played on Saturday (Day 4 of the Open Singles Event).
15. Rounds 3 and 4 will be played on Sunday (Day 5) along with the playoff for Third & Fourth.
16. Games will not be timed, unless necessary (see Conditions of Play, point 14).
17. Most matches in the Knockout will be single banked.
18. The 8 losers from Round 1 proceed to a Y Event in Round 2.
19. The 4 losers from round 2 in the X event will proceed to the Z event.
20. The Semi-finals and Finals of the X, Y and Z will be played on Day 5.

### **The Plate Event**

21. The Plate Event will be conducted at Cammeray & Chatswood CCs.
22. The Plate will be conducted as a Round Robin in 3 blocks, or Swiss, at the discretion of the Tournament Manager depending on number of entries.

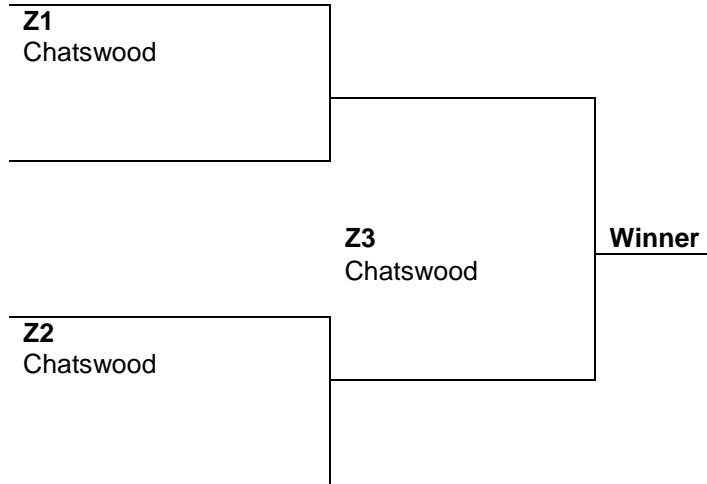
